## The Fifth Sunday of Pascha: St. Photini, the Samaritan Woman

Photini (or "enlightened") is the name given to the Samaritan woman whom Christ met at the well. She had a colorful history: she had had five husbands, and at the time she met Christ was living with another man who was not her husband. She was something of an outcast, which is probably why she had come to draw water at the sixth hour, the hottest time of the day. The other village women would have come at a cooler and earlier hour, and at noon she could be assured of being left alone.

As she was drawing water from the well, Christ asked her for a drink. Startled that a Jewish man was asking to drink from her water pot (for Jews had no such dealings with Samaritans, much less with Samaritan women), she began to speak with Him, Christ brought her to faith, speaking with divine prophetic knowledge of her past and of the things of God. She ran in haste to tell the others in her village of this man, who claimed to be the Messiah. Christ stayed with the villagers two days, convincing them that He was indeed the Messiah all were expecting.

Photini was evidently a woman of determination and spirit. It is said that she converted her four sisters and two sons to Christ and died a martyr. Her example reveals that we also, through baptism and faith, can find the spring of water welling up to eternal life. We also can drink abundantly of the water of wisdom and be ever glorified.
