Epistle

(Hebrews 7:26-8:2)

For such a High Priest was fitting for us, *who* is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens;

who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself.

For the law appoints as high priests men who have weakness, but the word of the oath, which came after the law, *appoints* the Son who has been perfected forever.

Now *this* is the main point of the things we are saying: We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens,

a Minister of the sanctuary and of the true tabernacle which the Lord erected, and not man.

Gospel

(John 10:9-16)

"I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture.

"The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have *it* more abundantly.

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.

"But a hireling, *he who is* not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf catches the sheep and scatters them.

"The hireling flees because he is a hireling and does not care about the sheep.

"I am the good shepherd; and I know My *sheep*, and am known by My own.

"As the Father knows Me, even so I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep.

"And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock *and* one shepherd."

Announcements:

It seems prudent at this time to suggest some precautions associated with the Coronavirus pandemic and flu in general and the reception of Holy Communion.

It is possible to receive Holy Communion in a fashion that minimizes the risks of spreading a virus. When you approach the chalice, open your mouth, tilt your head back slightly and allow Father to deposit the Holy Gifts on your tongue. This method serves to minimize contact of the Spoon with your mouth, lips and tongue. Also, Father requests that we temporarily refrain from kissing the chalice following Communion. Once the threat of the pandemic passes, customary veneration of the chalice could be resumed if the communicant feels comfortable doing so. Also, as Father mentioned last Sunday, if you feel ill or not comfortable receiving communion, please do not come to the chalice. Let Father know and he can bring the gifts to your house.

Finally, there have been questions associated with venerating icons and the Holy Cross. All icons, crosses and liturgical objects are wiped down with disinfecting wipes. To minimize one's exposure, we can venerate these holy objects by making the sign of the cross with a slight bow before them. Disinfecting wipes and tissues have been available throughout the Church. However, first and foremost the simplest precaution is to keep one's hands clean. Reciting the Lord's Prayer while washing your hands with hot soapy water fulfills the 20 second requirement recommended by the CDC.

In the midst of our Lenten journey to Pascha, we are given an opportunity, paradoxically, to honor and serve our neighbor as we struggle with this virus. Reach out during this time to those you know who are not able to get out and prepare for a quarantine. *'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'*

With daycare, school and work schedules being affected by the Coronavirus outbreak, recently graduated teacher Rebekkah Simkovich is offering her services to Parishioners to be with your homebound children should you need to be at work starting Tues., March 17. A Note from Fr. Stephan Regarding the Lenten Season: Too often we only focus on fasting or attempting to fast during the season. Fasting is only one way to help bring us closer to God. I have two simple requests for us to reflect and act on:

1. Truly treat others as we want them to treat us.
2. Work on our prayer life. I am willing to open the Church *anytime* throughout Lent for anyone who would like to pray.

Fr. Stephan will hear confessions after the scheduled services throughout Lent. If one cannot make it due to health or other noble reasons, Fr. Stephan will be glad to hear your confessions at your house.
