The Sixth Sunday of Pascha: The Blind Man

In the story of the healing of the blind man in John's Gospel, we see most clearly the salvation Christ offers all through baptism and faith. This man was born blind, with shriveled eyes and with no hope. Christ, who made Adam from the earth, again took earth, added spittle to make clay, and smeared it on the man's eyes, telling him to go and wash it off in the pool of the Siloam (Siloam means "sent," since the water was sent to that place through an aqueduct). He washed, and light flooded in through his eyes, ending his long darkness and giving him a new life. He came back to Christ seeing, confessing Him to be the messianic Son of Man, and worshipping Him.

The blind man thus becomes an image of every disciple, for all men are blind from birth in their spiritual eyes and need to call out to Christ in repentance. This call is answered in baptism: we also wash in the baptismal pool of Jesus, the One sent by the Father to be the Savior of the world. We also come back seeing and worshipping Him, confessing Him to be the Christ, the Light of the world.

Archdiocesan News:

- On **Saturday, June 29TH** there will be **10th ANNIVERSARY OF CONSECRATION CELEBRATION** held as an Archdiocesan event for His Eminence.
