Our Holy Father Simeon the Stylite

Simeon was born in Gesa in Cilicia, the son of a shepherd. When he was eighteen he entered a monastery nearby. He fasted greatly, eating only once a week and giving away the rest of his food to the poor. After about a year there, he left and lived in various places in Syria. In 423 he began to live in a cell built upon a pillar in Telanissus. The cell was about twelve square feet—so small he could stand or sit but not stretch out to lie down. Thus, he sought not only to discipline himself by asceticism but also to witness to others about Christ.

Indeed, many came to admire and seek counsel from the holy man, including some Bedouin Arabs, and many were converted through him. Simeon wished to avoid being continually pestered and to have time to pray. To avoid the increasing crowds, he lengthened his pillar throughout the years from its original ten feet to a final height of sixty feet. Yet he did give counsel to inquirers when necessary, being at their disposal every afternoon.

Simeon was full of kindness and sympathy, and his advice was practical, free of any fanaticism. He himself was no fanatic but only sought, by his dramatic witness, to direct men's attention away from the vanity of the world. Once he was sent an order in the name of the local bishops to come down from his pillar-cell and give up his extraordinary asceticism. Humbly, he prepared to obey. The messenger, however, was only testing his humility and, when he saw his willingness to obey, blessed him to continue as he was. Simeon remained thirty-six years on his style, serving God faithfully until he died in 459. His relics were taken to Antioch and buried with honor.
