Our Holy Father Cyriacus the Hermit

Cyriacus was born in Corinth and was made a reader in the church there while still a young man. He went to Jerusalem at the age of eighteen and visited many holy monks in Palestine—St. Euthymius, St. Gerasim, and St. Chariton. He was very ascetic, living for years eating only raw vegetables. It is said of him that the sun never saw him eat (for he ate only once a day in the evening) and never saw him angry at anyone. He died in peace in 557.
